

## Conflict Minerals

Seger Oy does not use conflict minerals in the production. Seger's suppliers are expected to use reasonable efforts to ensure that parts and products supplied to Seger are DRC "conflict-free," meaning that such conflict minerals do not benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Conflict-free means such parts and supplies do not contain metals derived from "conflict minerals" which are defined as:

- (i) columbite-tantalite (tantalum);
- (ii) cassiterite (tin);
- (iii) gold;
- (iv) wolframite (tungsten); and
- (v) any derivatives of the above.

The goal of this policy is to ensure that Seger's products do not directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups through mining or mineral trading in the DRC and adjoining countries. Seger requires its suppliers to establish policies, due diligence frameworks, and management systems, consistent with the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas, that are designed to accomplish this goal. Seger expects its suppliers to stay up-to-date with and to use validated conflict free smelters and refiners assessed by the Conflict-Free Sourcing Initiative and similar organizations.
